

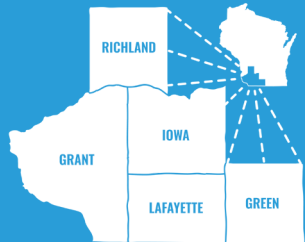


About Us

Opportunity House is part of the Recovery Pathways program, which exists to foster successful outcomes for people in recovery from the disease of substance use disorder. We serve residents of Wisconsin's Grant, Green, Iowa, Lafayette and Richland counties.


People typically find Opportunity House after they have participated in a substance use treatment program. Four to six same-gender house residents work, pay program fees and help maintain a sober and drug-free house.

Sobriety is a requirement for acceptance and ongoing residency at Opportunity House.

SWCAP is a nonprofit 501(c)3 anti-poverty organization working to eliminate the causes and conditions of poverty in Southwestern Wisconsin.

Wrap-around Services

Through the Recovery Pathways program, residents have access to a range of services in the community.

- Recovery Meetings
- Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP)
- AODA Counseling
- DVR Job Search/Retention Services
- Education & Training Services
- Transportation Assistance
- Peer Support (A peer support specialist is assigned to each resident.)

Opportunity House is monitored daily and supervised by Recovery Pathways staff.

At Opportunity House, you can become comfortable living a sober, drug-free life.

All Residents Must:

-  Be an active member, in good standing, of SWCAP’s Recovery Pathways program.
-  Remain sober and drug-free at all times.
-  Attend the weekly house meetings.
-  Meet weekly with assigned peer support specialist, to discuss recovery goals.
-  Submit random UAs and breathalyzers.
-  Work or volunteer for an agreed-upon number of hours per week, which will increase after an initial period. Must verify hours to the peer support specialist.
-  Attend at least 3 recovery meetings/week, including substance use counseling, group sessions and/or outpatient treatment.
-  Address any mental health needs.
-  Sign and abide by the Opportunity House Guidelines, governing house expectations and community living requirements.
